



# School Internet Safety

The safety and welfare of all our pupils is always of paramount importance. Our duty of care covers all school activities, including internet use. We comply with all Department of Education regulations and actively promote safer internet use for everyone.



## How do we keep your child safe online in school?



### Filtering

All school computers have a strong filtering system. Pupils not have access to social media sites, such as Facebook, or streaming services, such as YouTube.

### Supervision

Pupils are carefully supervised when using the internet. Normally, they will be directed to a website linked to a lesson or topic.

### Education

Safer Internet and Stranger Danger are embedded in our school curriculum and discussed regularly with all pupils.

## How can you keep your child safe online at home?



### Supervision

Supervise your child if they are using the internet or playing an internet-based game. Actively discuss what sites they are using and who they might be chatting to online. Discourage your child from using the internet in an unsupervised area, such as a bedroom. It is worth remembering that children under the age of 13 are not permitted on Facebook.

### Filtering

Install an internet filtering system that will protect your child from inappropriate website. Your internet supplier, such as BT or Virgin Media, will be able to advise you on this.

### Education

Regularly discuss the importance of staying safe online.

### Time Management

Limit your child's time online. Encourage them to play outside with friends or join a club, such as boxing or dance.

### Games

Only purchase age-appropriate games. All computer games come with an age rating system.

### Mobile Phone

Monitor mobile phone usage. Regularly check the content on your child's mobile phone and text messages.
