

- St Bridger is one of the Parron Saints of Ireland.




Baint Bridget

- He is the patron saint of seafarers and travellers.




Baint Brendan

Feast Bay: 1st July Born: 1629 Bied: 1681

- St. Bliver Plunkett was born in Loughcrew, in Eo. Meath.
- When he became a priest in Rome, he was not allowed to return to reland because it was against the law to be arholic.
- He later became a bishop in 1669 and managed to get to reland where he built schools and taught about god.
- He had to go into hiding out was found and arrested for his beliefs. As a result he was found guilty and he was killed on July 1st 1681
- He is now the patron saint of peace in reland.

- He is the patron saint of Ardmore.




Paint Declan

- He is the Patron Saint of poets and bookbinders and one of the Patrons Saints of Ireland.





- Many miracles happened in her life. One of these was that she didn't need any food except the Holy Communion she got each day she went to mass.




Baint Ita
